## GOODRICH AREA SCHOOLS HOME OF THE MARTIANS

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Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Oaktree Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Oaktree Elementary School has not been given one of these labels.

At Oaktree, we tailor to a broad spectrum of learning needs, continuously seeking to enhance our students' achievements daily. Our philosophy emphasizes holistic child development and leadership skills in our students. We rely on a mix of norm-referenced and local assessments, such as the M-

STEP, Star Reading and Mathematics, NWEA Assessments, and the Benchmark Assessment System, alongside local formative and summative assessments to guide our instruction.

In our ongoing commitment to elevate English Language Arts (ELA) proficiency, we are currently in the fourth year of integrating a unified ELA curriculum across all grades, incorporating the Making Meaning and Being a Writer programs from the Center for the Collaborative Classroom. These evidence-based curricula promote uniform literacy education across grade levels. Moreover, we are utilizing the Focused Instructional Model for ELA throughout our school. This method, crafted by The Institute for Excellence in Education, enables educators to track student progress in foundational reading, critical analysis, and intervene when necessary.

To further enhance our students' mathematical skills, this year marks the fifth anniversary of our comprehensive adoption of the Bridges in Mathematics program in every classroom, which includes a targeted intervention component used by our math intervention team. We have also redesigned our math intervention strategies to include in-class support, aiming to provide focused assistance to students who need it most.

State law requires that we also report additional information:

- 1. Process for assigning pupils to the school:
  - a) Goodrich Area Schools is a free, public school district and adheres to all requirements outlined by federal and state laws regarding enrollments.
  - b) Goodrich Area Schools does not discriminate in admissions policies or practices on the basis of intellectual or athletic ability, measures of achievement or aptitude, status as a handicapped person, religion, creed, race, sex, color, or national origin.
  - c) Oaktree Elementary services all students in grades 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> who live in the Goodrich Areas Schools district. The school also accepts school of choice students from other districts to the extent that enrollment capacity allows.
- 2. The status of the 3-5 year school improvement plan:
  - a) After completing a Comprehensive Needs Assessment, we are continuing to monitor, revise and implement the School Continuous Improvement Plan using the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP) based on the needs of our students. Our district's and school's continuous

improvement teams work with stakeholders to evaluate school systems in order to make data-driven decisions and set goals dedicated to improving student outcomes.

- 3. A brief description of each specialized school:
  - a. Oaktree Elementary School does not have a specialized school. Students needing special education services are evaluated and serviced in the general education classroom with support and/or in the special education resource classroom.
- 4. How to access a copy of the core curriculum, a description of its implementation, and an explanation of the variances from the state's model:
  - a. The core curriculum of Oaktree Elementary School does not differ from the State's model. The *Common Core State Standards* are the standards for the mathematics and English language arts curriculum used by the staff to teach all of our students in grades 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup>. Michigan state standards are also followed in social studies and science.
